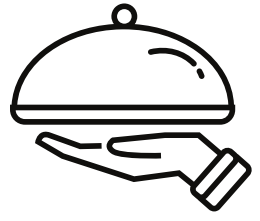


PHRASAL VERBS – FOOD

Match the phrasal verb to the definition.



pig out	boil over
whip up	heat up
chop up	eat out
pick at	tuck in
polish off	cut down on

DEFINITION	PHRASAL VERB
To cut something (usually food) into small pieces.	chop up
To have a meal at a restaurant rather than at home.	eat out
To warm food that has already been cooked.	heat up
When a liquid in a pot rises and spills over while boiling.	boil over
To eat only a small amount of food, usually without appetite.	pick at
To finish all of a particular dish or food very quickly.	polish off
To reduce the amount of something, especially food or drink.	cut down on
To eat a lot of food in a greedy or excessive way.	pig out
To start eating enthusiastically.	tuck in
To quickly prepare a meal or dish.	whip up
