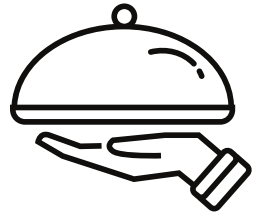


PHRASAL VERBS – FOOD

DEFINITION	PHRASAL VERB
To cut something (usually food) into small pieces.	
To have a meal at a restaurant rather than at home.	
To warm food that has already been cooked.	
When a liquid in a pot rises and spills over while boiling.	
To eat only a small amount of food, usually without appetite.	
To finish all of a particular dish or food very quickly.	
To reduce the amount of something, especially food or drink.	
To eat a lot of food in a greedy or excessive way.	
To start eating enthusiastically.	
To quickly prepare a meal or dish.
